

Ash Jain, a former member of the State Department's Policy Planning Staff, is a Non-Resident Fellow with the German Marshall Fund of the United States. He also serves as a consultant with the Eurasia Group and a Visiting Fellow with the Washington Institute for Near East Policy. During his service at the State Department, Mr. Jain focused on a range of strategic challenges facing the United States and its allies. In addition to covering political developments related to Iran and the Middle East, he analyzed prospects for strengthening multilateral alliances and partnerships and the future of the international system.

Previously, Mr. Jain served as an advisor for the White House Office of Global Communications, with the staffs of Senators Fred Thompson and Dan Coats, and as a law clerk with the Office of the White House Counsel and National Security Council. In addition, he taught constitutional law and politics as an adjunct professor at George Washington University. Mr. Jain has provided commentary and analysis for national and international media outlets such as NPR, C-Span, Fox News, BBC, France 24, Canadian Broadcasting, *The Hill*, and the *Weekly Standard*.

Mr. Jain earned a JD/MS in Foreign Service from Georgetown University and a BA in political science from the University of Michigan.
