

Jacqueline Newmyer Deal is President and Chief Executive Officer of the Long Term Strategy Group (LTSG), founded in 2006, which provides research and analysis on the future security environment to a range of government sponsors, including the Office of the Secretary of Defense and the National Intelligence Council. Recent studies and briefings that Deal has authored or co-authored have analyzed China's approach to the information technology "revolution in military affairs" (RMA); the military balance between China and India; future conflict scenarios in the South China Sea and Indian Ocean regions; China-Iran relations; and China's capacity for generating radical technological innovations. Deal's current research concerns Chinese nationalism.



Deal has testified on multiple occasions before the US-China Economic & Security Review Commission and briefed senior officials in the White House and Departments of State and Defense across several presidential administrations. She has led Summer Studies sponsored by the Office of the Secretary of Defense at the US Naval War College, and she has given seminars at a range of professional military educational institutions, service think tanks, and universities in the United States, France, India, Israel, Norway, and Singapore, among other countries.

Deal currently serves as a senior fellow of the Foreign Policy Research Institute in Philadelphia. She has been published in academic and popular media outlets including the *Journal of Strategic Studies*, the *New York Times*, *Orbis*, *Policy Review*, the *Weekly Standard*, and *World Politics Review*, in addition to appearing on CNN. Deal earned her bachelor's degree, *summa cum laude*, at Harvard and her master's and doctorate degrees at Oxford (New College). She completed postdoctoral fellowships at Harvard's Kennedy School and Government Department, where she was also an award-winning lecturer.

Deal is a term member of the Council on Foreign Relations and a member of the International Institute for Strategic Studies, as well as a reviewer for *International Security* and the *Journal of Strategic Studies*.
